"At least five people have died as dangerous winter weather continued to take hold in multiple states on Monday. The polar vortex made many roads treacherous, forced school closures and caused widespread power outages and flight cancellations.

Ice and snow blanketed major roads in Kansas, western Nebraska, and parts of Indiana, where that National Guard was activated to help stranded motorists. Around 300,000 customers were still without power Monday afternoon across Kentucky, Indiana, Virginia, West Virginia, Illinois and Missouri, according to electric utility tracking website PowerOutage.us.".
