Ahead of the storm on Friday, Governor Kehoe issued a State of Emergency declaration, which allowed first responders, road crews, and emergency management officials to coordinate efforts quickly. In a **statement** Tuesday, Kehoe stated there were some 47,000 residents who remained without power. Additionally, wildfires are burning throughout the state adding to damages. - Encourage holders to waive late charges.

HUD Disaster Relief Options for FHA Homeowners

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) offers relief assistance for homeowners with a mortgage insured by the Federal Housing Administration (FHA). If your home or your ability to make your mortgage payments is impacted by a Presidentially Declared Major Disaster Area (PDMDA), you may qualify for relief assistance to help you keep your home. U.S. Small Business Administration

The Small Business Administration (SBA) loans money to homeowners and renters whose homes have been damaged in a disaster. You may be eligible even if you do not own a business. To qualify for an SBA home loan your home must be in a presidentially declared disaster area, the loan must be for your primary home, and the loan cannot duplicate benefits from insurance policies or benefit programs. Before applying for an SBA disaster loan, you must register with FEMA. Visit the SBA website here to learn more.

USDA Food and Nutrition Service (FNS)

The FNS responds to active disasters by providing food assistance to those in need. The FNS may authorize <u>Disaster Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (D-SNAP)</u> when the President declares a major disaster with individual assistance. People who might not ordinarily qualify for the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP, formerly the Food Stamp Program) may be eligible for D-SNAP if they have disaster related expenses, such as loss of income, damage to property, relocation expenses, and in some cases, loss of food due to power outages.
